The Indiana Masonic Home at Compass Park:

- Opened in 1916 as a "Home for the Aged Mason, the Widow, and the Orphan."
- Served more than 8,000 Master Masons, wives, widows, and OES members, and 816 kids since opening.
- Includes more than 300 acres on the Franklin, Indiana campus.
- Serves around 350 current residents.

The Home is Continuing Care Retirement Community, which includes:

- Independent Living (Cottages and Duplexes)
- Residential Apartments
- Assisted Living
- Rehabilitation and Therapy
- Skilled Nursing
- Memory Care
- Hospice Care
- Home Health Care

New apartments with underground parking are on the drawing board.

There are several financial options for living on campus:

- Rental Plan
 - Pay as you go, with no long term commitment (no assignment of assets and income).
- Pay Plan
 - Pay entrance fee and monthly maintenance fee (no assignment of assets and income).
 - Includes continuing care. Services increase with needs.
- Fraternal Care for Masons, Widows, and Eastern Star members who have outlived their financial resources
 - Turn over assets and assign income.
 - o Includes continuing care. Services increase with needs
 - About 47% of apartment residents and 59% of assisted living residents are on fraternal care

You do not have to give up everything!
